## FROM THE CO'S TENT

Ranger Members,

I am both gratified and proud to be on board as USARA's new President. I am looking forward to working with you and your Board of Directors to make USARA even better.

Updates: In early June, we completed the largest election in USARA's history. Surprising, the margin of victory; over 70% of you voted for my message, a mandate for honesty, transparency and integrity. Bank on it!

Our Bylaws required establishment of the new Association Officer lineup by the end of last month. We made it; the required positions and those elected or appointed are listed, good men all. And I'd like to point out the diversity we now have. An Honorary Member, a Marine Web Master, a Ranger Tabbed US Air Force Legal Advisor, Commissioned and Non-Commissioned Officers from both the Regiment and Ranger Training Brigade, Branch representation from Artillery, Army Aviation, Special Forces and of course the Queen of Battle, Infantry. Korea, DOMREP, Vietnam, Grenada and the War on Terrorism, Some of our leadership are also members of the other major Ranger associations. This is not so with USARA, as our oldest members served in WW II, while our youngest members are fresh out of the Ranger course and on their way to Iraq or Afghanistan. So no matter in what unit or era one has served, if he's a Ranger, the USARA is *his* organization. Get your Ranger friends to join.

Although USARA's address is Fort Benning (for obvious reasons), we are not a Fort Benning/Columbus, GA focused association. Rather our leadership and members are spread across all fifty states, and beyond to our International membership.

BTW regarding the International Region, through the effort of another USARA member, an Aide to the SECARMY, Mike Ferguson, Aussie Ranger Robbie Robinson gets to add the US Presidential Unit Citation to his previous US award of the Silver Star. Well done Robbie. Thanks Ranger Ferguson for making that happen.

I am excited about our moving forward as USARA's new President, and achieving things you will be proud of. I add that all the appointments I've made have received 100% approval from the Board. We're on a roll! Even though It's summer vacation time, and I am in Spain as I write this. Still, we have accomplished several things already:

1. We have selected next years USARA Airborne Man of the Year, SFC (Ret) Dana Bowman, who was an outstanding speaker at our ARM in Branson. Go to [www.sabolich.tv/dana.htm](http://www.sabolich.tv/dana.htm) to see the compelling video portion of his presentation at the ARM.
2. Look in the next issue of the Ranger Register for our Budget and Financial Statement as promised. It was too involved and needs a review prior to its being put in this issue of the Register.
3. I attended a meeting of Ranger leaders on 28 July for the American Ranger Monument Association, which as you know has been and continues

to work to erect a fitting memorial to the American Ranger, from colonial times, to the present (hopefully it'll be built along Arlington Cemetery's Memorial Drive). This was a good early-on opportunity for me to meet key players from a number of the other Ranger groups. Senior Rangers, Generals Wayne Downing and Buck Kernan (both speakers at past USARA ARMs) are lending this effort their full assistance. Although there remain countless hurdles, I am very optimistic

Now, as I look around the CO's Tent, I find that Steve Maguire has left things in pretty serviceable condition. Great! That box of Old Grudges has been tossed out. So, let it be known that my Tent Flap's open to every member, or qualified Ranger for that matter. Anyone feeling bruised over past issues, now's the time to come on back and help us improve the association. Naturally, there are no Rank or personality issues here. "Ranger" is the single title we all know, codified as it is in our bylaws.

### ARM 2008 NORTHERN REGION HOST

The responsibility for hosting the 2008 Annual Ranger Muster falls on the Northern Region. We need a proposal that will entice the greatest number of USARA members to attend ARM 2008. Location must have some significant attraction for both Rangers and their families and friends. The meeting hotel should have reasonable rates and alternate accommodations at lesser cost should be nearby. The meeting hotel must have a restaurant and adequate banquet facilities and meeting space. Additional places to eat should also be within walking distance. Transportation to the location should be possible by low price airfare and easy access from interstate highways. Transportation from the meeting hotel to the attractions of the area should be easy by public means.

We will need a committee to actually setup and run ARM 2008. Please send me your suggestion for location and host committee by 15 October 2006. (e-mail [waltgr5@att.net](mailto:waltgr5@att.net)). Someone on the committee MUST have e-mail!

Dates are important to avoid conflict with other events; such as the Special Forces Convention, Special Operations Association, and other Ranger Associations' (World War II, Korean War, Vietnam, et al) meetings. If possible, we should not conflict with the 2008 Ranger Rendezvous (Ranger Hall of Fame Induction and Ranger Training Brigade Change of Command) although its dates depend on the RTB Change of Command and will not be known until spring of 2008. I will try to get dates of these events so we can avoid them.

### MEMORIAL DAY PARADE – WASHINGTON, DC

USARA was invited to participate in the 2006 Memorial Day Parade. The invitation came too late to arrange a USARA presence in the parade, but President Steve McGuire, Treasurer John Senior, and myself attended in the reviewing area. The parade theme was all eras from the colonial times to Gulf II and included marching

units from many states and communities. ## RTB CHANGE OF COMMAND

On 6 July 2006, COL K.K. Chinn turned over command of the RTB to COL Gregory L. Hager. COL Chinn has moved on to a new assignment with SOCOM at McDill AFB, Florida. "K.K. is not only an outstanding Ranger leader but one of the best in the entire Army," said former post commander, retired Maj. Gen. Ken Leuer, one of several members of the Ranger family, past and present, to attend the event. Leuer is considered to be one of the founding fathers of the modern Rangers. "And I honestly believe we'll be saying the same things about Colonel Hager two years from now."

Colonel Hager was commissioned from West Virginia U in 1984. His initial assignment was with the 82nd Airborne Division. Following completion of the Infantry Advanced Course he was assigned to the 10th Mountain Div. at Fort Drum for duty as a Company Commander. He subsequently was assigned to the Joint Training Readiness center at Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas and later as an Ops Controller at Fort Polk. Following CGSC, he served as S-3 of 2/1 Inf in Alaska and as Bde S-3, 172 Inf Bde. He served in Southern Command as a J-5 before returning to Ft. Benning to command the 4th Ranger Training Battalion. Following completion of the Army War College he served as J-3 and Chief of Staff. Joint Task Force Guantanamo at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. He returned to Ft. Benning to command the RTB.

## RANGER ROY BOATMAN PASSES

Rangers Roy Barley and Rich Ehrler reported that Ranger Roy Boatman died of a heart attack on July 26 while attending the P/75 unit reunion in North Carolina with his wife Joyce. Funeral services were held on July 31. Roy served in "Papa" Co., 75<sup>th</sup> Rangers while in Vietnam. P Co. was assigned to the 5<sup>th</sup> (Mechanized) Division near the DMZ. Roy's son, Darrell, a Marine EOD gunnery sergeant was killed in Iraq in November of last year. Our hearts and prayers are with the Boatman family. ## Francis Kohl—WW II Ranger Passes

Tim Swain, USARA Central Region Director reports that services for WW II Ranger Francis Kohl of Bourbonnais, Il were held on July 26. Ranger Kohl was very proud of his Ranger service and was buried in his Ranger blazer. His records show combat service in Normandy, the Ardennes, and elsewhere in Europe. He was awarded the CIB.

## IRISH RANGERS?

Yes, the Republic of Ireland (Eire) Defense Forces maintains an army ranger unit. The Unit is officially designated "Sciathán Fianóglach an Airm," which is translated as "the Army Ranger Wing." There is no direct English translation of the term 'Fianóglach' so the designation Ranger is the accepted version. 'Fianóglach' links the traditions of the '*Na Fianna*' (Legendary Irish Warriors) with the present day Irish Defence Forces (Óglaigh na hÉireann). Qualified members of the unit wear the Fianóglach shoulder flash insignia.



Beginning in the late 1960s, the personnel from the Irish Defense Forces were sent to take part in the U.S. Army's Ranger School. Graduates of this program returned to Ireland and established a new school, very similar in mission and organization to that of the U.S. Army. By 1980, it was decided that the skill level of the members had evolved to a degree which warranted the establishment of an official Army Ranger Wing (ARW). The missions of this unit are multiple, including long range patrolling, training of other units, VIP security, anti-hijacking, hostage rescue, and counterterrorism.

Unit strength is approximately 100 men who are organized into two assault platoons, a support platoon with medical, EOD, aviation, etc. Each of the assault platoons has five assault teams of 3-4 men each. These men are all volunteers, selected from other units already serving with the Defense Forces. Advanced tactics are taught in parachuting, combat diving, small boat handling, and mountaineering. Interestingly, ARW members are returned to their original units after a set period of time, thus ensuring their expertise will be shared throughout the Defense Forces. The Ranger Wing trains with other SOF groups around the world, including US Army Rangers, the U.S. Army's Delta Force, British SAS, Australian & NZ SAS, GIGN, GSG9, Dutch Commandos, Royal Dutch Marines and the Swedish Special Forces.

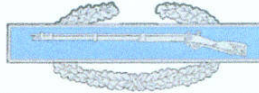
